Chairman's Report.

Last time it was just a small world, but now it is a topsy-turvy world as well.

Here in the East it has been dry - very, very dry. Not much rain has fallen since the spring and our once green and pleasant land looks a bit more like the Sahara rather than the usual verdant landscape. Water courses have shrunk and large cracks now appear in the ground. They are big enough to swallow a rabbit whole, let alone a pheasant chick. However, whilst crops have been seriously affected not all is doom and gloom.

Wild game has thrived in huge numbers; hares in particular are numerous and I have only had to cut our grass at home four times this year! Hares are so abundant that many handlers are hurriedly arranging some special training for dogs not used to the quantities.

In lingering warm weather we started off, as usual, shooting in shirt sleeves but it was not until late November that coats were donned.

And so it was on our training day which, as seems to be the order of things these days, we held in the first week of October. In line with previous years we were able to get in some training right at the start of the season and I am sure that all dogs present, and their handlers, learned a lot - especially as we had the benefit of advice from Brian Botterman, who is someone who knows more than a little about hunting dogs. The opportunity to learn how to run dogs properly in large, open spaces is invaluable as, in my opinion at least, a dog which can do that well will also succeed in woodland and along hedge-rows, whilst the converse does not always apply.

We held our four field trials before the end of November. All were in sugar beet or rape throughout and there was a result at every trial, details of which will appear in the next newsletter. Whilst the three novice trials were held on grounds where there are numbers of reared and released birds, which, at least that early in the season, tend to hang around a bit, the all aged stake at Wardy Hill proved interesting. There it is mainly wild birds which, although present in abundance, do offer a different dimension. As we drove down wind in the trailer to start the day, there were literally dozens of birds on the stubbles surrounding the sugar beet but they quickly took cover at our approach.

It was obvious that many handlers were more concerned about covering every inch of their beat rather than getting on with the job of nailing birds, so the ensuing noise coupled with their slow progress dictated a poor outcome.

As at all the trials, only pointed or worked birds were shot and at Wardy Hill that meant just three, plus a pointed hare that had to be left because the gallery was strung out along its escape route. There are lessons in this for everyone, not least of which is that silence is golden.

Sadly, before long, the season will once again be over, but until then there is much to do. We will be going at it hammer and tongs ourselves and I wish you all the sport you can manage over this festive time of the year. It will get tougher as even the tame birds get wiser, but the enjoyment at achieving success with your dogs increases proportionately as well.

Good hunting and (once again, with apologies to Dave Allen) 'may your dog go with you'.

The minutes of the last Annual General Meeting had been previously circulated in the newsletter. It was agreed that they were a true record of the meeting.

4) Matters Arising

It is proposed that a Seminar is held in 2012 between Spring Pointing Tests and the AGM in May. The Secretary has been communicating with Mr Frank Kane and Mr Kane has been very helpful and supportive offering many suggestions to promote the breed in the Show Ring as well as in the Field.

5) Chairman's Report

Chairman David Winser announced with sadness the recent death of the first "Longhair" Field Trial Champion, Wamilanghaar Drumelzier, better known to all of us as "Jack". Condolences were expressed to his owner/trainer Theo Gould.

Activities that the Club had organised and events during the last year were discussed and the Chairman informed the meeting of this year's plans.

Crufts Best of Breed this year was Arany's Elko owned by Mr W L MacAndrew-Uren. Bred by Mr L. Wilks and Ms B Moss. Congratulations to both the owner and the breeders.

The first of this year's Spring Pointing Tests was held at Balsham, Cambridgeshire by kind permission of Robin Vestey on 26th March 2011. Three dogs were graded. The second Spring Pointing Test was held at Dunphail, Morayshire on 2nd April 2011 by kind permission of the Honourable Mark Laing where five dogs were graded.

Our annual working test will take place on Sunday 10th July at Gill Mill, Ducklington, by kind permission of Mr John Smith. Our working test continues to be a very popular day out. It is hoped that with the financial cuts that are affecting everybody, we will have a good entry. Please support this event again this year as the income from this day goes a long way to pay for the Club insurance. This working test takes a lot of organisation and help was sought from members to help with dummy throwing, stewarding and general organisation on the day.

The ground at Wardy Hill where we currently hold our All Aged Stake was offered to the HPRFTA for a training day for prospective judges. However there were no entries and the day was cancelled it being too late to organise a spring pointing test for the Club. It is hoped that this ground may be made available to the Club to hold a spring pointing test next year.

Three Novice field trials and an All Aged Stake were held last season. The entry for our Club Field Trials was very good with a full card and reserves for each trial. Many competitors personally thanked the hosts for their hospitality and commented on the Excellent quality of the grounds.

It is hoped that we will be allowed to run an Open Stake in the 2012/2013 season.

The FCI held a 100 year Jubilee field trial in March and there was an entry of 94 dogs. David and Eileen Winser went over for five days to watch the trials. The winner of the FCI trial was a GLP dog bred and handled by Theo Carbjin the breeder of the first Questor Longhair. The winning dog was Iron Vd Kreppelse Heide and he is the son of Alice Loorderse of Questor.

The Chairman thanked those people who, during the course of another very successful year, have done so much to help with the organisation and the manning of Club events and promotion.

6) Secretary's Report

Eileen Winser reported that the Club was running very smoothly and thanked the Committee for their support over the past year. Thanks also to Paul Jackson, Paul Williams, Jo Hart, Terry Croft and Claire Smith who have done so much to give Discover Dogs a "new look".

An Open Show will be held on 25th September at Cottesmore Village Hall. There will be two new trophies on offer one for Best Puppy in Show and one for Best of Breed. Our Club Show Secretary, Maureen Court has been asked to Judge and there will be 7 classes for dogs and 7 classes for bitches. Rosettes will be awarded for 1st to 4th in each class. Schedules will be sent as soon as available and will also be downloadable from the web site.

It was suggested that video film showing dogs taking part in agility competition and also pointing test and field trials could be shown at the Open Show to demonstrate just what they are capable of doing once trained. Jo Hart agreed to look into the agility side and Eileen will try to get film of dogs working.

The Bryantscroft Trophy for excellence in field trials goes this year to Rob Gould with Wamilanghaar Cara with 60 points. Cara was awarded a 2nd in an All Aged Stake and two 3rd places at Open Stakes. Theo Gould was congratulated for her Open Field Trial win with Wamilanghaar Elixir and her total Field Trial points this season is 30.

It was noted that there was no more room on the Bryantscroft Trophy for future winners and Sarah Bond agreed to ask about having a new base made for it and engraved.

7) Treasurers Report

Accounts for the year were handed out. Chris Hartnoll told the Meeting that the Club was in a very healthy state and that much of it was due to the donations received from David and Rob for subsidising the Field Trials and to David and Eileen for subsidising the AGM, working test and general administration of the Club.

The Associate Membership is up on last year and that is mainly due to the offer of lower entry fees to members.

It was suggested that the dog grooming video made for the Club some years ago by Rebecca Scheurleer could be made into a CD as very few people now have video players. Eileen Winser to look into it.
