## It just gets better!

What a winter it has been. Exciting from the outset with the promise of a new trial ground in Cambridgeshire, in the event we ran three absolutely brilliant Novice trials on sugar beet - ground where the conditions were exactly the same for every dog and we could see what was happening all day long. I love the stuff! It is a great leveller, especially when one gets tangled up with wild rather than released birds and it really does sort the competing dogs out. The birds just run circles around the dogs given half a chance and those who get into the awards really have earned their place there. Furthermore, in the main birds are shot off the point, thereby tying in that bird to the retrieve, with the ultimate test of steadiness in between.

We started with Tixover towards the end of October. It was not a particularly easy day but throughout there was a steady supply of birds to test the dogs fully. Later one of the Judges commented it was an excellent ground quite capable of use as an Open Stake (- perhaps, in time?). There were no fewer than 25 entries for this early season trial, so word on the standard of German Long-haired Pointer grounds appears to be getting around.

Later that week we went to our new ground at Wardy Hill, near Ely. Again, it was all on sugar beet, but this time there were greater areas with just wild birds present - a much more exacting scenario indeed. However, the more experienced dogs won through, with sufficient game to test all runners.

In November we returned to Attleborough to round off our own little list of trials in fine style.

Looking to the season in prospect, I am delighted to announce that this year we will be running four trials in total. Again, they will all be on sugar beet but, following some work by your Committee, the Kennel Club have given us permission to hold All Aged Stakes, so that is the direction we will be going in for the next three years until we can apply for Open status. The dates of the 2010 trials are:

**Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> October 2010. Novice Stake. Tixover, Leicestershire.**

**Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2010. All Aged Stake, A.V. HPR. Wardy Hill, Ely.**

**Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> November 2010. Novice Stake. Croxton, Norfolk.**

**Monday 29<sup>th</sup> November 2010. Novice Stake. Attleborough, Norfolk.**

Further details will be published on our web site when confirmed.

And it didn't stop there. In March of this year we were able to secure an exciting new pointing test ground at Balsham in Cambridgeshire, by kind permission of Robin Vestey. Although arranged at the last minute we had an excellent Easter Monday on superb ground with a number of gradings being made. We were doubly blessed in having Jerry Kew and Brian Botterman as judges (it was a bit like The Last of the Summer Wine) and a very enjoyable and rewarding day was had by all. As I have only ever shot at Balsham I did not know how much ground we had to go at, but felt a bit of a fool after nervously asking the keeper. "We have 22,500 acres here, Sir" he replied. I do hope we are offered this ground again next spring.

Two weeks later we were back at Dunphail in Morayshire for a second spring trial, and again word seems to have spread. There were a total of 24 entries so it was necessary to arrange two further judges and have two groups going into different parts of the moor.

Six dogs were graded at Balsham and five at Dunphail; reports appear elsewhere in this Newsletter.

As well as the new trial planned at Croxton in November I will, if there is sufficient demand, also arrange a training day there for those who wish to enter their dogs in trials in the coming season. This will obviously be early on in October and follow the usual format of preference to members and dogs just embarking on trials, with no eliminations and the emphasis on giving the right training to suit the needs of each of the six dogs we will run. If you are interested in attending such a day please let me know as soon as possible and I will make the necessary arrangements.

Last - I am not a lover of dog obituaries. To me they are heartbreaking, personal affairs which in my view should be overcome in isolation. However there is one old soldier that many of you might well want to hear about. Gaoithe, together with Iris Kreppelse Heide, founded Questor Longhairs in this country. Having recently celebrated his sixteenth birthday he went out in the paddock last Monday with his pack and bimbled about in his own way. All the girls were there, together with two 3 month old great, great grandsons. In the warmth of a spring morning he lay down on the grass and went to sleep. Later we noticed that something was different. All of the dogs were lying nearby and the two puppies were cuddling up to him. There was an unusually strange, serene, silence. He will not wake up again.

Seventeen Field Trial Awards and years crammed with hunting moorland, farmland, woods and the marshes of the Fens leave happy memories of an honest dog. We can tell many tales of adventures together, but of course they remain important only to us. He has now joined other past heroes, in a prominent position near Iris and to his flight pond so he can watch the wild duck come in of an evening. I say His flight pond because it was he who excelled in finding the elusive, wounded duck that occasionally hid there from the night before. Such work was always for him.

**Judges Report**

Weather conditions; a warm dry day with a decent breeze

Scenting conditions: Apparently poor but variable. All dogs were run into wind. Pointed birds were close to the dogs. None of the many hares were pointed when stationary on ground covered by the dogs. There was much non-productive pointing and [mainly] non-productive boring into wind as if on scent of game.

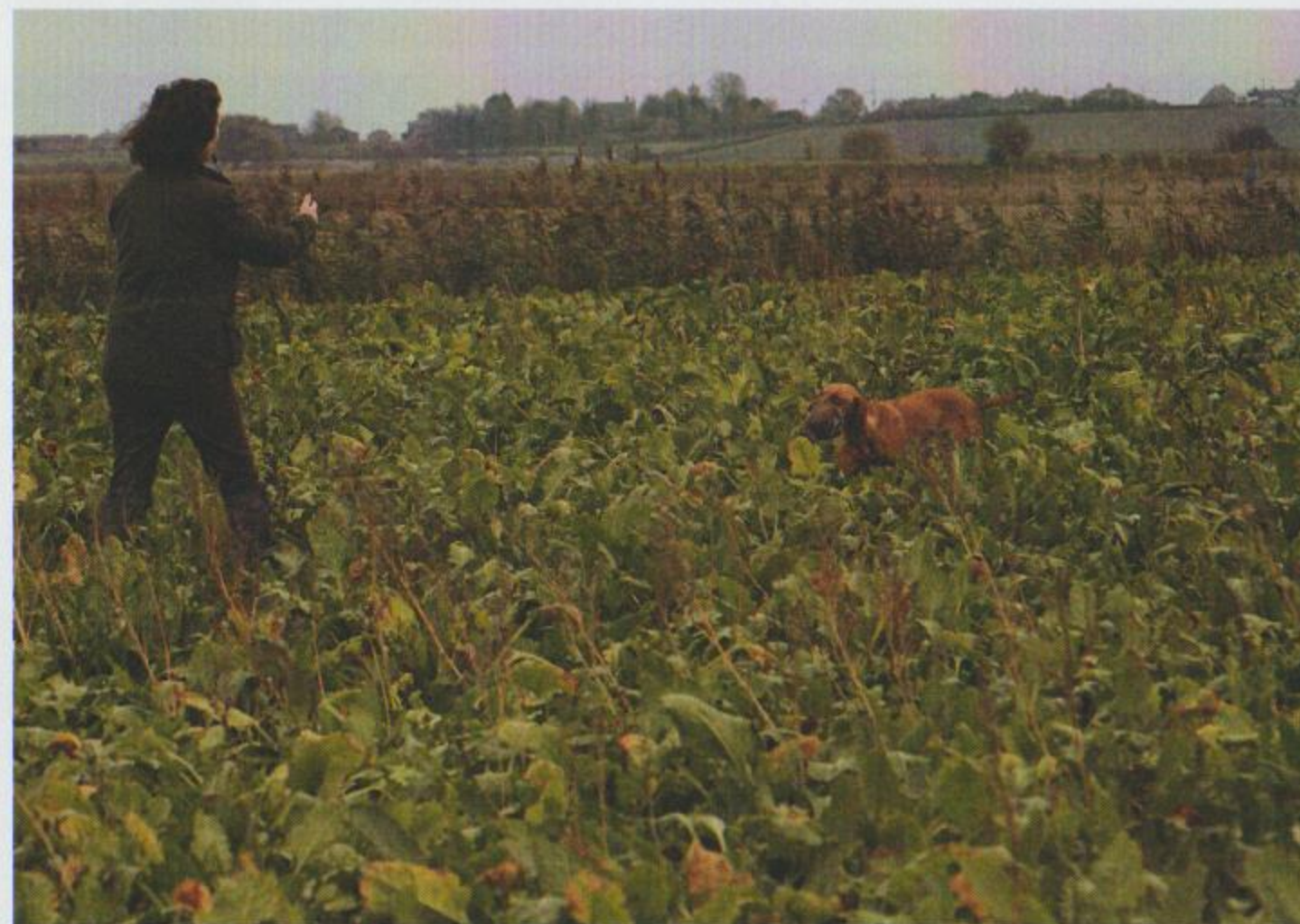
The dogs ran into wind on sugar beet for the entire trial with land to spare. Every dog had hares on its beat. The first round was predominantly on wild pheasant and partridge. The second round was on reared pheasant and partridge. Many birds were seen throughout the day

With so much land to play with each handler was asked to work from one edge of the beet with the freedom to take in as much of the rest of the field as they wished. We felt that this freedom from artificial restriction would give all the dogs the best opportunity to demonstrate their natural hunting and game finding ability especially when their quarry was wild birds.

Unfortunately many dogs became bogged down with residual scent [possibly from the many hares] failed to establish a useful hunting pattern and missed large chunks of their beat while their handlers failed to impose their authority to insist on thorough ground treatment. Some dogs gave every impression they were following a strong scent of game moving in front of them and the handlers took the calculated gamble of following to the bitter end rather than to decide when to pull their dog off the scent, retreat a few yards and cast off to begin quartering again. That is a judgement call but the first course of action is really putting all the eggs in one basket whereas the second option at least gives a chance to pick up other game on the beat as well as intercepting whatever the dog has been following.

The three Longhairs did not feature in the awards but showed how beautiful a naturally flowing quartering pattern can be.

Handling was generally quiet until dogs ignored the stop whistle. Eleven dogs had a second run and were quickly into birds. The guns shot well but for many frustrated dogs there was no delay between flush and retrieve. Better ground treatment with appropriate control would have given more dogs the opportunity to feature in the awards.



**Results:**

2<sup>nd</sup> Place. Greenwire Lenci HV b handled by the Owner Jean Robertson

On her first run, she finished off the field of sugar beet in such a fashion that one was confident that there was no game there. With time still on the clock everyone was taken by trailer to park on the stubble downwind of the next field of beet. This bitch worked the ditch leading up to the beet then opened up to quarter her ground well. She went on to have a non-productive point.

On her second run, she was fifth dog in a field of beet containing more reared birds. She started quartering but soon started to pull left, she came on point and on command worked forward until a single partridge flushed. The left hand gun did well to down this bird to give a retrieve of some 50-60 metres on a potential runner. This young Vizsla marked well and went

straight to the point of fall where she quickly located the partridge and after some low level aerobatics she caught and retrieved the lively bird tenderly to hand. She went on to make a very satisfactory water retrieve to much applause.

Our thanks for the success and enjoyment of this trial are due to all those who made the day possible and particularly to our generous hosts Julian Palmer and Nick Border. Also to our Chief Steward Janice Hawkes, to David and Steve Winsor who shot so well, to the Red Flag and Picking-up dog handler and last but not least to the competitors who enlivened the day with their good humour.

We would like to thank the German Longhaired Pointer Club for their invitation to judge this well organised trial on an excellent ground and for their kind gifts. We wish the club and competitors every success in the future.

### **Report on the Novice Field Trial at Attleborough, Norfolk on 16<sup>th</sup> November**

A Novice Field Trial was held at Attleborough and our grateful thanks to Mr Philip Milburn, and the Keeper Mr Chris Airy.

#### **Judges Report**

It was a dry and sunny day but scenting conditions were quite difficult due to strong winds and birds running ahead. The dogs were mainly worked on sugar beet with some hedgerows and white grass. There were plenty of partridges and pheasants but they were generally very flighty.

Most of the dogs were worked with a cheek wind and the general standard of work and handling was good. Many of the dogs were a pleasure to watch, however most of them had trouble holding birds resulting in birds flushing well ahead of where the dogs indicated.

A 3<sup>rd</sup> place was awarded to Rory Major's Tournesol Destinee at Bryantscroft. Brittany bitch.

The first run was at the end of a long field of sugar beet with a cheek wind. The bitch pointed a covey of partridge of which one was shot, she did not mark the point of fall but hunted nicely onto the bird and retrieved to hand. She then pointed a pheasant at the edge of the beet, flushed on command and had a straightforward retrieve.

The second run was again on sugar beet with a cheek wind and which changed to a backwind at times. The bitch hunted a long way ahead hunting a nice pattern. Sadly, the only pheasant on her beat flushed as she turned into the wind. The water test was performed faultlessly.

This nice, hard hunting bitch was sympathetically managed by her handler

## Report on the Spring Pointing Test at Balsham, Cambridgeshire on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2010 by kind permission of Mr Robin Vestey.

This was the first time we have been invited to Balsham and our many thanks go to our host Mr Robin Vestey who took time off from his busy schedule to watch some of the dogs run. The keeper Mr Andrew Collins met us at the start of the day and made sure our dogs were able to have the opportunity to point partridges. The judges were Brian Botterman and Jerry Kew and it was a fantastic day with everybody being able to drive around in their own vehicles to see each dogs run.

### Judges report

The ground was perfect for judging Spring Pointing Tests. Every run was in rape at a nice height to see each dog run. Most dogs had 2 pairs of partridges on its run. All dogs ran exclusively into a good steady wind. The weather was sunny although a little cool.

As judge's we were looking for correct ground treatment as the number one priority.

I was disappointed that there were only two Junior dogs on the card as I feel strongly that spring pointing tests are most important for young dogs.

The ground was excellent, with a good stock of partridges and some pheasants but not too many hares to distract the dogs.

### Linda Westron Castlepoint Nerfortiti

This was the handlers first ever run in a Spring Pointing Test and it showed with continued interference with the bitches quartering pattern which made for erratic ground treatment. However, she found and had an excellent point on a pair of partridges. It took scent drove forward with a high head carriage, held until the handler arrived and flushed gently on command. Because of the poor ground treatment, she was graded **Good**.

### Eileen Winser Questor A'Chóire Ghlais

In her first run this bitch ran with great drive and purpose with very good head carriage, covering lots of ground, at times taking too larger bits of ground, although always turning into the wind but there was no game on this run.

On its second run the ground treatment was much improved, she pointed and produced partridges with nice style and was graded **Very Good**.



Group Two.

**Klinahund Breeze. GSP b. Handled and owned by W. Calder. Junior.**

This dog ran as number 15. She was hunted straight into wind and it displayed good ground treatment with a steady, even pace; a good distance either side of us and a nice flat pattern, just taking the right amount of ground forward each time. Occasionally she turned the wrong way for wind, particularly on the right hand side, but invariably this was handler error – blowing the whistle at the wrong time. This dog ran for a full eleven minutes, during which she located, moved up to and had a staunch point on a single grouse. She held the bird and enthusiastically flushed it on command. She was hunted on, having an unproductive point, again on the right hand side, and a further unproductive point in front in the 11<sup>th</sup> minute. (which later proved to be a pair of grouse which had run on). We graded this dog **GOOD**.

**Kenmilquin Fraven GWP. b. Handled and owned by Jackie Hay. Adult.**

This dog ran at number 17. She proved to be a hard running, wide ranging and experienced dog with very good ground treatment. On her outrun she bumped a single grouse, but this was before she had had any chance to settle at all. Thereafter she was a joy to watch; running at an even pace throughout; always turning the correct way for wind; with a flat, wide, even and measured pattern. During her ten minute run this dog left no doubt in our minds that, had there been any birds anywhere on her beat at all, she would have found them. In the event she located, moved up to, pointed and held a pair of grouse, which were flushed enthusiastically on command. We graded this dog as **VERY GOOD**

Group one

**J. Harley GWP. Bitch Kayleigh Over and Under.**

This dog ran at number 6. On its first run, on the side of a hill with the wind coming over the hill on its left hand side. Its ground treatment was better once the handler took the dog down the hill where it had a very good point on a hare and waited until it was given the command to flush. The dog was steady to the hare making a hasty retreat.

On the second run its ground treatment was better but we felt the handler was not able to read the dog at times and know if it was pointing or just indicating scent. The dog went on to positively point a brace but moved a short distance when the birds flushed. **Graded Good**

**Mrs E Winser GSP Bitch Questor A'Choire Ghlais**

This bitch covered a wide flat pattern equally on both sides of the handler, never once turning downwind and with the minimum of handling. On the far right of her beat she indicated scent, drew forward then locked onto point. The bitch waited for her handler then dropped to the ground moments before Eileen arrived, anxious not to flush too soon. The birds were flushed positively on command and the bitch remained perfectly steady.

It was a perfect example of ground treatment resulting in a positive find in difficult conditions. Had we been shooting I am sure a perfect left and right would have followed! I could find no fault or criticism with this performance and we were delighted to be able to award an **“Excellent”** grade.
